Blood Pressure Campaign

Blood pressure is a measure of the force that your heart uses to pump blood around your body. A blood pressure test is the only way to find out if your blood pressure is too high or too low, because most people won't have any obvious symptoms.

Ovarian cancer is one of the most common types of cancer in women. There are around 7,400 new ovarian cancer cases in the UK every year, that's 20 everyday. Ovarian cancer accounts for around 4% of all new cancer cases in females in the UK (2015). The most common ways to diagnose ovarian cancer are a blood test and ultrasound scan. Following on from this and with regard to women's health, we would also like to take this moment to remind you about smear tests...

Smear Test Campaign — Remember to book your smear test

Cervical screening, also known as a smear test, checks the health of your cervix. This is not a test for cancer, but one to help to prevent it. All women and people with a cervix aged 25 to 64 should be invited by letter. Try not to put it off as it is one of the most effective ways to protect yourself from cervical cancer. During the screening appointment, a small sample of cells will be taken from your cervix. This sample is then tested for any changes to the cells. Finding abnormal changes early means they can be monitored or treated so they do not get a chance to turn into cervical cancer. You'll get your results by letter, usually in about 2 weeks.

If you are within the age of 25 to 64 and have received a letter, but not yet booked your screening, please contact the surgery now and help reduce your risk.



NHS Health Check

If you're in the 40-74 age group without a pre-existing condition, you are entitled to a free NHS Health Check every five years.

It can tell you whether you're at higher risk of getting certain health problems like diabetes, stroke & heart disease & can detect potential health problems before they do real damage and provide advice on what to look out for.
